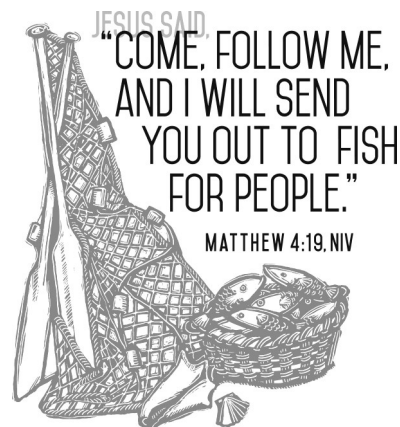


From the Desk of
Pastor Ron

Some of you who know me know that I like to fish and hunt but since it is not hunting season, have been doing some fishing. In fact, this year my wife and I took a fly fishing evening course a Wichita State extension and I have even tried my hand and tying my own flies for fly fishing. I was struck by the irony of this. A fishing fly is made from both artificial and natural materials to mimic either an aquatic or terrestrial insect or bugs that start off in the water in their larva stages but hatch out to become flying insects. The goal is to tie a fly that is close enough in similarity to the real insect that it will fool a fish into striking it. In other words, at the core it is a game of deception and I had to think to myself, is that really the business that a pastor should be in? I mean Jesus used the analogy of bringing people to Christ as fishing for people but in Jesus' day they used nets to gather. Jesus doesn't use deception, but there is someone who does, someone who flashes things before our eyes that promises to feel the need not just of our stomachs but of our deepest needs and desires. The enemy often uses flashy, shiny packages that promise security, value and being wanted which is a need for love, he promises satisfaction and happiness wrapped up in a bottle,

substance, or overnight relationship but in the end that promise of a quick fix, that 'fly' turns out to have a very nasty hook attached with a barb. The hook catches on and traps while the barb makes it very difficult to get the hook out. All that the enemy promises is either a counterfeit, or half-truth, a deception that makes us worse off in the end and sometimes a slave to the one attached to the other end of the hook. God doesn't use hooks. He doesn't use deception, but Jesus demonstrates His own love for us in that while we were yet sinners He died for us (Rom 5:8). He lays down His life for the sheep (Jn 10:11). How very different from the deceiver who comes to steal, kill, and destroy.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT "AN EASIER GOSPEL"

"The time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires." (2 Timothy 4:3)

Paul's letter to Timothy outlines the fact that trials are normal for the dedicated believer and, as a result, many fall away and seek an easier Gospel.

This easier Gospel teaches that Christ provides a buffer from all problems and provides unlimited prosperity and the freedom to spend profits as desired. In other words, God is so blessed to have us on His team that He is forced to intercede for fear that we will get discouraged and quit (as a great many do).

The truth is, God doesn't promise to buffer us from all difficulties for two basic reasons.

First, anyone would have to be simpleminded not to follow Christ if He buffered His followers from every problem. Instead, as Paul said, our faith must be tested by fire—in other words, faith for sustaining us through trials, not paving a path around them.

The second reason for not buffering a believer from all problems is so others will witness God's peace in the midst of turmoil. The unsaved can rely on money and position during good times, but during bad times emotional chaos usually reigns.

The Lord has promised a "crown of life" to those who persevere under trial and learn to love Him even more." (*An Easier Gospel* by Larry Burkett)

In April, the Unified Budget giving of \$15,959 exceeded the actual expenditures by \$1,623 and giving for the year has exceeded expenditures by \$5,799.
